4. What role should technology play in addressing climate change? What are the tensions between technological solutions and behavioral or political change?
5. To what extent does the race between countries to lead in artificial intelligence mirror past arms races, and what lessons from history should guide how governments approach it?
6. Social media companies profit from keeping people engaged, but high engagement often means more outrage and division. How should societies balance free expression, corporate profit, and mental health?
7. As artificial intelligence becomes better at creating art, music, and writing, what does that mean for how we define human creativity and the value we place on it?
